

Dear Dean of Medical Education, Harvard University, Dr. Jules L. Dienstag,

Almost all Japanese private universities which have medical departments gloss over to have a “Not Applaudable (*Subarashikunai*)” brain and performance. They have not a bright brain, and use the broker for the entrance examination and take hefty educational expenses in secret.
