Dear Alumni Reunion,

I haven't seen you for a long time. Please let me inform you that I will not attend the alumni reunion to be held in August, 2016 again.

Today, July 13, 2016, I ran a medical checkup on 25 teachers at a high school in Asahi City, Chiba Prefecture, as a part-time physician in the morning and went on to manage the hospital ward for the outpatient internal department and hospitalized patients at a convalescent (long term care) hospital for the elderly (45 beds) in the same city in the afternoon. At night, I attended a One & Only Resorts' party in Aoyama, Tokyo, where I met the world's best bartender, who was from Nara Prefecture, before my discussion with the cocktail **"Chairperson"** in Seoul scheduled from September 25 to 27 (??). On the day of our alumni reunion, namely, August 13, 2016, I will work as a full-time doctor with 40 staff members who work at the outpatient department for the internal medicine department and 60 inpatients (a single doctor handles 60 hospitalized patients) on a daily basis, at a convalescent hospital for the elderly (239 beds) near Mobarra City, Chiba Prefecture throughout the day and will enjoy my single footloose, fancy-free and another academic time, tipping my cocktail glass at the space called *Convection of Intelligence and Sensibility* at the Roppongi Hills Club, which marks a sharp contrast with a usual packed commuter train, taking a view of a dry and rather desolate city during the Obon Festival, a Japanese Buddhist custom, Tokyo at night. I am still neither a specialist physician (*Senmoni*) nor a certified physician (*Ninteii*) of the Japanese Society of Internal Medicine though I turned 54. In the Tokyo metropolitan area where the University of Tokyo's bachelorship talks and is trusted, however, my doctor of medicine degree from Mie University (Graduate School) helps me win patients and their families' confidence in me. Doctors who graduated from private universities, including those graduating from Tokyo Medical University who work at Tokatsu Hospital (in Nagareyama City, Chiba Prefecture; 330 beds in the general ward and 36 beds in the convalescent ward), can neither keep medical records nor write a medical certificate (in Japanese and English) properly. I hear that doctors, including those working for Tokatsu Hospital, say, "At the moment, I am not a doctor who works for a university hospital, so I am unable to write a medical certificate in English. (Please ask Dr. Shida of Mie University to fill in the special column for the ontological and ophthalmologic affairs as well)."

I launched the academic homepage **"chairperson.jp"** for all people on the earth on January 26, 2016 which is written in English like the universities in the foreign countries like Paris University and Mie University use English as usual. " # One day, a Shizuoka University (near first-class public university, Japan) graduate who is called 'brilliant (*shuusai*)' said that Hamamatsu University School of Medicine (near first-class public university, Japan) has a 'Brain (*Atama*).' [Shizuoka University and Mie University (near first-class public university) are good universities. On the other hand, Aichi Medical University and Fujita Health University (both third-class private universities, 'No small potatoes') are not good universities in Japan.]" Further, a bachelor of Shizuoka University who is seen at the first description on the "Notice" in the homepage **"chairperson.jp"** is just our alumni of the table tennis club of the Junior High School Attached to the Faculty of Education, Mie University, "Wicked (*Aku*) Shuji" (present staff member of Asahi Calpis Wellness Co., Ltd., Japan). I adopt him to our homepage for Sports and Medical Education in 2016.

For me, the Sanikai, the Alumni Association of Faculty of Medicine, Mie University, and the academic clique of national universities, such as Kyoto University and the University of Tokyo, have been a formidable hindrance that has affected my whole life (For further information, please refer to my documents including the one to the Japan Society for Medical Education dated May 30, 2015 on **"chairperson.jp"**). Those graduates from national universities, much less those from private universities, are not my friends any more. As I must

ensure work as a physician in the Tokyo metropolitan area, I am and will not be able to attend an Alumni Reunion of the Junior High School Attached to the Faculty of Education, Mie University organized either in Mie Prefecture or in Tokyo. At the aforementioned convalescent hospital for the elderly where I have worked on a full-time basis from the morning of every Thursday through the evening of Saturday, which includes two night shifts, since January 2016, the atmosphere of the hospital as a whole is the same as that of Kyorin University (Tokyo), the alma mater of the president and director of the hospital. It is “a not-brilliant and backdoor (60 million yen for medical education, just for your information) space,” which does not agree with “a space for intellectual inquiries” at Fukushima University or Mie University. In 2003, two practitioners who graduated from Dokkyo Medical University (who were our client, “*Uesama*”) filed a severe (*Kibishii*) complaint against a salesman (who earned a bachelor’s degree from Waseda University) and me (a doctor of Medical Science who graduated from Mie University), which did not draw a line between academically outstanding universities (Waseda University, Mie University...) and those not (Dokkyo Medical University, Dokkyo University...), we (salesman and doctor) ended up resigning from our each post when I was working as the head physician at the Utsunomiya Branch of Daido Life Insurance Company, Japan. And now, I have no way of protecting my current contract as a full-time physician from being terminated as I may be practically fired at any given moment, like our story of dismissal mentioned above.

Kyorin University (President: Dr. Yutaka Atomi) and Dokkyo Medical University (President: Dr. Noriyuki Inaba) don’t have the ability to discuss medicine from the view point of their own, they are not brilliant or intelligent, and gather six million yen education cost per student. There is no reputation in Tokyo and Tochigi Prefecture that Kyorin University and Dokkyo Medical University are intelligent and respected universities. So they don’t draw a line between academically outstanding universities and those not. Their “Gold Covered Hands” which assures their rich life is not same as the “Gold Medal” at the Rio Olympic Games in 2016 because the International Olympic Committee bans to use the doping drugs at the Olympic Games on the earth in the 21st century. In the 20th century, it is said that “One mark needs one hundred yen at the private money-powered backdoor university” in Japan. Namely, “30 marks medical students need to pay sixty million yen through the broker such as a member of the Diet or the alumni reunion of the university, 50 marks students to pay forty million yen and 70 marks students pay twenty million yen to enter the private university and pass the national examination for medical practitioners for six years or more in Japan.” Actually, we have never heard in Tokyo and Tochigi Prefecture that “We (Kyorin University or Dokkyo University graduate) use a broker but we are not a ‘Backdoor University’ ” or “We (Kyorin University or Dokkyo Medical University) gather sixty million yen for the medical education per medical student, but we are not a ‘Not-Brilliant University.’ ” They usually like vulgar jokes (“*Shimoneta*”?) about their wives, nurses or friends, greenhorns and foreign (conspicuous) cars...as same as Prof. Hiroshi Tanaka and his medical team of Juntendo University (Japan). Of course, we heard and speak opinions based on the academic papers, magazines and newspapers in English each other in “a space for intellectual inquiries” every day.

本日2016年7月13日は、私非常勤内科医師として、午前千葉県旭市内の高校にて先生25名の健康診断、午後は旭市内療養型（老人）病院（療養45床）の内科外来と入院患者さんの病棟管理。夜は東京の青山でOne & Only ResortsのPartyに出席して、Cocktail「Chairperson」についての私の9月25日～27日Seoul出張におけますCocktail談義に向けて(??)、奈良県からいらっしゃる「世界一の」Bartenderさんご挨拶、の日程です。また同窓会当日2016年8月13日日中は、千葉県茂原市近くの療養型（老人）病院（療養239床）で、60人の入院受け持ち患者さんの医療（医師1名で患者60人の主治医）にて、毎日患者さんを見守ってもらってます40名の外来、病棟Staffと共に常勤内科勤務です。そして夜は、いつもの通勤満員電車と対照的な六本木Hills Club「知性と感性の対流空間」で、人気（ひとけ）の少なくなった、Dryな街東京を眺めながら、独身お一人様Cocktail Glassを傾けています。54歳になった現在も内科専門医、内科認定医ではありませんが、「東京大学学士」が信用される東京首都圏で、「三重大学（大学院）医学博士」は患者さんと家族の信用になり助かっています。私立大学におかれましては、例えば、東京勤労者医療会 東葛病院（千葉県流山市、一般330床、療養36床）の私立東京医科大学などの先生方も、医師カルテ、診断書の記載（使用言語：日本語、英語）はお出来になりません。「今は大学病院の勤務医師ではありませんので、英語の診断書は書けません。（耳鼻科、眼科等の専門欄も、内科の三重大学志田先生にご記入いただいて下さい）」（東葛病院医師）等お話を伺います。

本年2016年1月26日、学術Homepage「chairperson.jp」を開設しました。Paris大学など海外の大学、三重大学共に、普段通り英語を使用しています。なおHomepage内「Notice」の最初、「# One day, a Shizuoka University (near first-class public university, Japan) graduate who is called “brilliant (shuusai)” said that Hamamatsu University School of Medicine (near first-class public university, Japan) has a “Brain (Atama).” [Shizuoka University and Mie University (near first-class public university) are good universities. On the other hand, Aichi Medical University and Fujita Health University (both third-class private universities, “No small potatoes”) are not good universities in Japan.]」の静岡大学学士は、附中卓球部、あの「悪（あく）の修二」（現カルピス株式会社）のことです。「Sportsと医学の教育」のHomepageに、採用にしておきました。

私にとって、三医会（三重大学医学部同窓会）、京都大学、東京大学の国立大学の学閥は、人生を左右してきた強い障害で（詳細は、「chairperson.jp」内2015年5月30日付日本医学教育学会宛文書等参照）、私立大学の皆さんはもちろん、国立大学出身者も現在は友達ではありません。東京首都圏で何とか内科のお仕事を確保していかなくてはなりませんため、これからも三重大学附属中学校の同窓会は、三重県開催、東京開催共に出席出来ません。2016年1月から毎週木曜日朝より土曜日の夕方まで2晩の当直を含めました常勤勤務中の上記療養型（老人）病院でも、病院全体の雰囲気は理事長兼病院長の出身大学と同じ私立杏林大学（東京）。「秀才でない裏口空間（数字を挙げますと6,000万円）」で、福島大学、三重大学などの「知性の探究空間」とは合いません。2003年に、営業職員（早稲田大学学士）と医師の私（三重大学医学博士）に、お客様（上様）でみえる私立獨協医科大学（栃木県）の開業医の先生方から、頭のある大学と無い大学（頭を使う大学と使えない大学）の区別をされない厳しいClaimをいただきまして退職に至りました大同生命保険会社宇都宮支社の医長勤務と同様、いつまた私の常勤内科勤務が契約終了（事実上の解雇）となりましても、防ぎようがありません。
