Dear Harvard Krokodiloes,

I will send my **“Chairperson 20th Anniversary Treatise”** to you, 12 students in Boston and try to make an appointment to see your professor who specializes in Medical Education of Harvard University on 10 or 11 December, 2013 for 30 minutes. The University of Tokyo, a top university in Japan, has disregarded my study at the society and gave me “Academic Harassment” at the university. Two professors (Dr. Wolpaw and Dr. Wong) who visited the University of Tokyo’s International Research Center for Medical Education from USA in 2012 and 2013 know about this. To tell the truth, I had assumed this situation in Japan more than 10 years ago. Following the East Japan Earthquake (March 11, 2011), the U.S. government was irritated about the fact that the Japanese government failed to promptly obtain precise information about the serious trouble at the Fukushima Nuclear Power Station from Tokyo Electric Power Company. Your alumnus, President Barack Obama, delivered a speech to American citizens including the gist “I am lucky to have an opportunity to study at the most outstanding university on the earth” during the first presidential campaign. So, I expect that the university in the USA where I have stayed in Idaho for three weeks in my childhood will not overlook my treatise, especially the part of the backdoor problems, serious troubles which happen in secret everywhere around the world, not like the attitude of “I can talk about other people, but I can't talk about myself,” but like the president’s word. Harvard Krokodiloes, we welcome you as one of Harvard University’s “Envoys” and only students of my class. Thank you.
