Dr. Shida provides an explanation to Mr. Olle

“These stories at the medical scene in Japan are reported in the recent 2015 the ‘One and Only Chairperson.’ The Ministry of Health, Labour and Welfare which publishes ‘The Annual Health, Labour and Welfare Report’ every year boasts; ‘The medical care system in Japan has achieved the world’s highest level of average life expectancy, thus realizing a high level of health/medical standards.’ And the University of Tokyo and Kyoto University, Japan Broadcasting Corporation and Asahi Shimbun Company don’t have the ability to report the medical science and medical treatment based on the background on the private money-powered backdoor universities which use a broker and gathered much money in Japan. Dr. Masayoshi Kosho is a medical doctor from Hiroshima University (public university, Japan), M.D., Ph.D. The president of the geriatric health services facility ‘Akatsukaen’ (120 beds, Tokyo) does not go the face-to-face rounds of his 100 patients as an only full-time doctor in charge of medicine and enjoys playing tablet games with the particular sound ‘Houston’ while on duty. I hear care workers sometimes give a bitter (‘*Tsurai*’) sigh when I go the round because they feel Dr. Kosho’s attitude to medicine and nursing care is different from them. Against me (regular part-time doctor), Dr. Kosho rounded his head abruptly like the heroine of the movie ‘*Exorcist*’ when we pass each other in the corridor several times, and said ‘You think only about yourself! (Dr. Shida studies without thinking about the world.)’ Then he expelled me from the medical office to the pharmacist’s office in the facility on March 24, 2015. It is similar to ‘Academic Harassment’ by the Sanikai (Alumni Association of Mie University Faculty of Medicine) or academic clique of the University of Tokyo. In the Ina Hospital (150 beds, Saitama), a patient at the rehabilitation department said in the consulting room, ‘The examination (check-up the physical condition) by Dr. Shida (regular part-time doctor, physician) is too slow, so it takes more time than another full-time female doctor’s examination. Green! (Dr. Shida is a greenhorn.)’ on April 2, 2015. However, the rehabilitation section and secretary room of the hospital could not answer her graduating university and specialty (Internal medicine, Surgery...etc.) clearly (because she does not reach the level of the internal medicine of physician who is a graduate of the public university). On June 4, 2015, a full time male doctor spoke loudly in the doctor’s room, ‘Don’t be silly! The director (Dr. Hirohiko Sakamoto) of the Saitama Cancer Center (500 beds, Saitama), should kneel down to the Ina Hospital (Director: Dr. Shigeyuki Matsumura)!’ His way of speaking was like Japanese traditional gangstar. A pharmacist said ‘He is perfectly idiotic! Never use (that drug)!’ in the Tanabe Hospital (45 beds, Chiba) on April 15, 2015. The fact is the following; Dr. Nobuo Noguchi (full-time doctor) is suspected to have directed on the blood pressure control about his cerebrovascular accident patients improperly. And nurses gave an antihypertensive drug just by his medical order. Dr. Shida (regular part-time doctor) asked Dr. Kazuomi Kario, Visiting Professor (2004) of Columbia University and Professor of Jichi Medical University (Japan) about this problem on July 6, 2013. Then Prof. Kario’s opinion missed the point. Mr. Tetsuo Tsuji, former Administrative Vice-Minister (2006) of Ministry of Health, Labour and Welfare (Japan) and Professor of the University of Tokyo joined a panel discussion as a guest speaker with Vice-President of Japan Medical Association, Dr. Toshio Nakagawa held at a four-star hotel in Saitama Prefecture on June 10, 2015. ‘Doctor (Shida) has bad manners!’ He got angry and stopped answering to my questions about the money-powered backdoor universities in Japan unilaterally. When thinking about this trouble calmly, I had checked that Mr. Tsuji’s business suit was all wrinkled and his bag was shabby like students’. He has never mentioned the professors’ (bad) manner, although he also gave a lecture from the University of Tokyo’s viewpoint. Two professors of the University of Tokyo dropped their head abruptly to me in 2012. Possibly, Mr. Tsuji was an aged man and impaired hearing my introduction as a researcher (doctor’s degree, ‘*Hakaseni-naru*’) and complained from the level of the bachelor’s degree. General Manager, we see ordinary cases similar to the above on the not-wonderful medicine or not-advanced medical care in the 21st century. These are not rare cases in Japan.”
