We would like to request that you answer my basic questions to you before my planned brief discussion with a professor of Harvard University who is specialized in the medical education in Harvard University on December 10 or 11 this year, 2013. I believe that our study is useful for the medical circles in the USA and world. But I, Doctor and Chairperson of Sports — the fastest pace in history, am anxious that the top universities conceal their own backdoor to maintain their honor like many universities in Russia and China do with a help from President, Prime Minister, General Secretary and Chairperson. In fact, Vice President for Information Services and University Librarian at Columbia University said “No comment” to us and Japan editor-in-chief for the Wall Street Journal refused to talk with me.” [President Barak Obama graduated from Columbia University and Harvard University.] Prof. Jha, if you consider that there is no problem that I have an appointment with a professor in Harvard University for a brief discussion on the basis of the four necessary questions, please introduce me someone who is a professor and specialized in the medical education and also who does not say “No comment” like “Father of Japanese Medical Education” responded to me. If I am asking you too much, it may be better to contact Dr. Jules L. Dienstag, Dean for Medical Education of Harvard University directly, for an appointment on December, 2013 instead. These will become a double check for Harvard University from a viewpoint of my research. Regarding myself and my “**Chairperson 20th Anniversary Treatise**,” most professors of the University of Tokyo including 30 professors who have not replied to my letter seem tolerate their traditional “Academic Harassment” to me which has been repeatedly conducted in the medical world. We welcome the professors who are Harvard University’s “Brains” in Japan and expect a professor will become the first fellow of my research in Boston on behalf of Harvard University.
