We would like to request that you answer my basic questions to you before my planned brief discussion with a professor of University of Oxford who is specialized in the medical education in University of Oxford on January 23 or 24, 2015. I believe that our study is useful for the medical circles in the United Kingdom and the world. But I, Doctor and Chairperson of Sports — the fastest pace in history, am anxious that top-class universities conceal their own backdoor to maintain their honor as many universities in Russia and China do with a help from President, Prime Minister, General Secretary and Chairperson. In fact, I contacted the Medical Science Division Office, University of Oxford and asked for the name of Dean or Professor for medical education on October 9, 2014, and got a reply e-mail, saying [“Please contact the Secretary to the Director of Clinical Studies on e-mail. Sorry I am unable to help you any further.”](#) from Oxford. Just only this answer written in blue color (not good manner «?» to the Doctor and Chairperson of Sports) in Oxford on October 13, 2014. No other response including Director of Clinical Studies. Prof. Gray, if you consider that there is no problem that I have an appointment with a professor of University of Oxford for a brief discussion on the basis of the four necessary questions, please introduce me someone who is a professor and specialized in the medical education and also who does not say “No comment” as “Father of Japanese Medical Education” did to me. If I am asking you too much, it may be better to contact, Dr. Alastair Buchan, Head of the Medical Science Division of University of Oxford directly, for an appointment on January 23 or 24, 2015 instead. These will become a double check for University of Oxford from a viewpoint of my research. Regarding myself and my **“Chairperson 20th Anniversary Treatise,”** most professors of the University of Tokyo including 30 professors who have not replied to my letter seem tolerate their traditional “Academic Harassment” to me which has been repeatedly conducted in the medical world. We welcome the professors who are University of Oxford’s “Brains” in Japan and expect a professor will become the first fellow of my research in Oxford on behalf of University of Oxford. Dr. Jules Dienstag, Dean for Medical Education of Harvard University had given me an intentional walk in Boston on December 10 and 11, 2013, like most Japanese baseball pitchers.
