We would like to hear comments from Paris University on May 24 or 25, 2016. The following are two academic conversations with the Doctor and Chairperson of Sports in the 21st century.

Mr. André Terrail: Owner of La Tour D'Argent Paris (July 14, 2007)

Dr. Shida asks Mr. Terrail

"I had lunch with your father at La Tour D'Argent in Paris in 2001. Mr. Tom Wedgwood invited me to the Christmas Party at the Wedgwood Tokyo Shop in 2003. Wedgwood excludes 4% of all products made in the factory in Stoke-on-Trent and Mikimoto excludes more than 90% of all pearls of the pearl farm in my home prefecture, Mie Prefecture. So we should first exclude products that do not match our criteria, then offer the selected products to consumers. May I understand it is correct?"

Mr. Terrail replies Dr. Shida

"Exactly. La Tour D'Argent has very strict criteria to keep very high quality. Ducks can take feed in the water and exercise enough in nature 24 hours and are airlifted with keeping the blood inside the body to La Tour D'Argent Tokyo from France more than every few weeks. Only our restaurant cooks the French dish using fresh duck in Tokyo. I can't reveal the confidential number of excluded ducks that do not match our criteria, because it always changes according to the weather and the season of the year. La Tour D'Argent does its best to create best quality in Paris and Tokyo."

Dr. Shida replies Mr. Terrail

"I can understand both the value and the limitation of the criteria today in a sense. On the one hand, I'm glad to get the eminent number (bird's serial number) without any exclusions about the French duck dish. My impression is that has a smaller impact than the Peking duck at the Zenshutoku restaurant in Beijing and a larger size than the French dish by Mr. Joël Robuchon, but more elegant than the French dish at the L'Osier restaurant run by the Shiseido Group and a little less burnt than the French-Mediterranean cuisine of the Picasso restaurant in the Bellagio Hotel Las Vegas. On the other hand, there is a class that Hollywood Stars say is not the same as the star class according to the Michelin criteria. La Tour D'Argent has never lowered its level to the level of one-time Michelin one-star restaurant, the Le Jules Verne in the Eiffel Tower and near Michelin one-star Japanese restaurant, the Kinugawa in Paris, especially the name that synthesizes all. ...This view through the window of La Tour D'Argent Tokyo is different from that through the window of La Tour D'Argent Paris. Japanese have different law and stricter ('Kibishii') morals about male-female relationships. However, we should exclude doped athletes and backdoor doctors, thereby maintaining our name internationally. 'Exclude first, then provide the number.'"

Dr. Shida asks Ms. Sakamoto

"I would like to ask the Japanese Nursing Association about the inappropriate male-female relationships between the doctor and nurse at the workplace today. The inappropriate male-female relationships between the doctor and nurse can be detrimental to team medicine from the standpoint of fairness ('kouseikan'). What does the Japanese Nursing Association think about this moral problem with literature reviews? President, Prof. Sanada also can answer this. My academic papers, 'Introduction letter upon joining in the Saitama Medical Association (Japan) (May 1, 2006)' and 'To Dr. Tsutomu Fuse; President of Yokohama City University (September 1, 2009)' are your references."
