Dr. Shida replies to Prof. Davit

Prof. Masahiro Tanabe, the "Best Teacher of Chiba University," and Dr. Arie Rotem, the "Father of the Japanese Medical Education" and Emeritus Professor of the University of New South Wales (Australia), couldn't answer this difficult question, and the awkward situation of the Japanese medical education did not change last month. According to our rigid evaluation, the brains of the University of Manchester also couldn't stop the "Zero Marks Medicine" which Tokyo Medical University (one of the third-class private universities in Japan) has continued for a long time without the medical education this summer.

The following is a letter to more than 20 high class hotels in Stockholm and Oslo.

My name is Dr. Shida. I'm currently traveling in Stockholm and Oslo on a tight schedule from July 23 to 28 and stay at the Grand Hotel and Hilton Hotel in Stockholm, Grand Hotel Rica and Radison Blu Plaza Hotel in Oslo. The reason I'm writing you is to inform you that I will send my research "**Chairperson 20th Anniversary Treatise**" dated January 26, 2012 to 20 executive assistant managers of four and five star hotels in Stockholm and Oslo including your hotel till next spring. The treatise was sent to Emeritus Prof. Yukio Okamoto, the former Chief Producer of NHK TV (Japan Broadcasting Corporation) first this month and will also be sent to 30 professors of the University of Tokyo in August. Unfortunately, the publication of the "**Chairperson 20th Anniversary Treatise**" has been delayed because the University of Tokyo Research Center for Medical Education (Director: Prof. Kazuhiko Yamamoto) has not contacted me since December 2011 up to June 2012. As I am going to maintain to ask about Japanese medical education for the doctors and staffs who are graduates or officials of the backdoor, money-powered universities at the University of Tokyo Medical Education Seminar which is held monthly, an indication of your interest in such a project of mine would be highly appreciated.

Dr. Shida provides an explanation to Mrs. Kjellström

“Prof. Shinya Yamanaka, Director of the Center for iPS Cell Research and Application, Kyoto University who successfully made iPS cells in 2007 at the fastest pace in history is said to be one of candidates for the Nobel Prize in Physiology or Medicine in the near future. However, a new professor of Mie University who was graduated from Kyoto University fired me (Dr. Shida) without handing over information about my work as the Doctor and Chairperson of Sports from a former professor who was also a graduate from Kyoto University in 1997. The Kyoto University alumni have done a lot of things most people wouldn’t think were right. We hope the Nobel Prize Award in Stockholm will not encourage the ‘Vicious Research’ conducted by the academic clique of Kyoto University which is against the scholar’s spirit.”

Dr. Shida provides an explanation to Mr. Haslerud

“Mr. Al Gore, former Vice President of the United States and the International Panel on Climate Change received the Nobel Peace Prize in 2007 for their endeavor to stop the global warming. Mr. John Kerry, U.S. Senator, made a speech to U.S. citizens ‘We will end the backdoor draft of the National Guard and reservists’ on a CNN program in 2004. However, it is said that Americans couldn’t stop the backdoor because Mr. John Kerry didn’t become President. Despite pressure from the Japan Society for Medical Education and Japanese universities which have medical departments, I have worked hard to try to end the backdoor entrance-examination for universities since 1991.
