This is the first time for me to send a letter about our study to your TV corporation. I am the Doctor and Chairperson of Sports in Japan. It is my pleasure to introduce our academic homepage "chairperson. jp" which is visited from all over the world including China (??). For your information, I have informed about the "Chairperson 20th Anniversary Treatise" which is an unconventional style (not a full paper style) to the professors of the University of Tokyo in 2012, Harvard University in 2013, Oxford University in 2014 and Paris University in 2015 for the "Doping-Backdoor Theory," the general managers or assistant general managers of hundreds of four or five-star hotels around the world for the "Chairperson Cocktail" and the regular members of the Vienna Philharmonic Orchestra for "My Way" in (2010 and) 2016.
