To Customer Care, Pfizer Inc.,

I tell your (biggest pharmaceutical company in the world) customer survey about the Pfizer's drug briefing session in the Tokyo metropolitan area. On February 24, 2014, a Pfizer's staff opened the Pfizer's small briefing session with the director, head nurse and druggist of our hospital for 30 minutes.
