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We would like to request a short comment of the owner chef of the restaurant “Maison Troisgros,” which has kept the Michelin Three-star for 40 years. Prof. Kazuhiko Yamamoto, M.D., Ph.D., the present director of the University of Tokyo’s International Research Center for Medical Education established in 2000, has never showed his own backdoor. It was revealed that he has used an entrance examination broker and received more than sixty million yen in education fees on the part of St. Marianna University School of Medicine (private third-class university, Japan). The journalists of the Asahi Shimbun Company haven’t checked most of backdoor-wealthy universities in Japan. They have published the book “University Ranking” since 1994, whose evaluation criteria in 2014 also include neither “brokers” nor “huge sums (more than sixty million yen «six hundred thousand US dollars», ‘*Bakadakai*’).” If interpreted favorably, it means Asahi Shimbun Company doesn’t imitate my study because they have a pride. Chef, I (Dr. Shida) have checked the “Not Clean Kitchen” of these backdoor-wealthy universities since 1999, like Michelin and published the “**Chairperson 20th Anniversary Treatise**” in the year 2012. Most professional journalists around the world have achieved their results in the 21st century. “See no evil, hear no evil, speak no evil.” And in recent years, I have sometimes paid attention to the policemen who are walking with dangling their hands at the Narita International Airport, “Mr. Policeman, you lack a feeling of tension like the doctors at the third-class university, Nippon Medical School Narita International Airport Clinic.” Dr. Shigeo Akaiwa who had a carrier of working for Jichi Medical University and Saitama Medical University as a “Sword-bearer (*Tachimochi*)”(?) watches TV before 9 am or after 5 pm in the hospital director’s room often without writing his patients’ clinical records including the name of disease at his hospital. Chef, we also know that the doctors from Japanese private universities often lack a feeling of tension and they are lenient (“*Amai*”) in themselves, and we cannot respect them because of their “Not Clean Kitchen.”
